Motivation varies from excitement and financial gain to identity theft and more.

In general, two kinds of property are stolen: personal items and car components.

Personal items that owners may leave in their cars include loose change, laptop computers, GPS devices, cellular phones, portable music players and wallets or pocket books.

Targeted car components change as the different features become highly valued. For a time, stereo equipment was targeted, but now air bags and expensive parts such as catalytic converters, high-intensity discharge or xenon headlamps are prized. DOJ

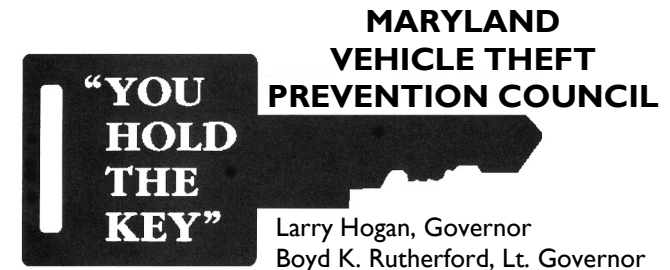

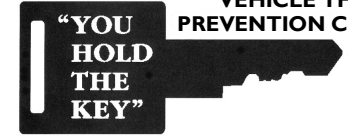

Should you become the victim of a burglary or theft, you will be able to provide important information to law enforcement officers. The chances of recovering an item increases when more information about an item, especially the serial number, is recorded. It is important to list model numbers and serial numbers. You should photograph any item that does not have a serial number and update this list each time you obtain additional items. Review the form annually. Use additional pages if necessary.
